• Teacher Liaison Report; teachers unable to be here; Coach reminding candy donations end tomorrow; collecting in front office

• Principal's Report; thank you for coming out; huge shout out to the PTA; he has worked with many PTA groups and he sees how organized/ best interest at heart for the children;

• Coach created a movement hallway; gives students the ability to move all day to help control their behavior and stay engaged in learning; helps them stay focused

• Self Esteem Winners announced two weeks ago; Lincoln Leader; some kids come home with a certificate but they didn't understand why; the certificate will be with a letter so they know why they earned the award;

• Juice & Jot: the principal askes the students a set of questions and have an honest question; talk about what they like/ love about Lincoln/ teachers/ principal; ask what they want from their principal and teachers; some students want to interview Armano and going to announce the answers on the loud speaker; the children were chosen by the teacher on characteristics based on STRIDES; students will rotate monthly but goal is an initiative comes out of each meeting; the students will be different then the winner of the month; helps teachers look at the students from a SEL

• Caring

 Also held one to one meetings with teachers; many said they want to be heard and seen

 Election Day next week they will be exploring this more; will be guiding themselves into Lincoln Learns will be a home

- Culture of Caring: building and classroom culture

- Clubs; there will be a menu of items available for kids to choose from

• What grades will participate? Clubs will be based on grade labels for signing up

• Will it be a lottery? Yes, if there are 20 seats and 25 students sign up

Teachers are out of the classroom often. How can we decrease that? There are 6 permanent subs in our building; tends to be the same substitute; usually half day; percentage is about 3-5% of missed class time by classroom teacher
Are substitutes certified? Our subs have graduated with a degree and have passed their certifications; many are just starting out

• Wants to do when the TC is going to be out of the district? New assistant superintendent is doing a curriculum study on each subject with principals co-chairing; each committee is talking the pros and cons

- Other Reports:

• SEPTA new fundraiser is 10 Days of Holiday Fun; two options are 12 days of winter themes or 8 days options; for example one is hiding 6 candy canes; order by 11/17; giving out on the 11/20; any questions you can email; money goes to 8<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade scholarships for vocational schools; next meeting is 12/4 @6:30 in Middle School cafeteria

• SMBA membership is on their website; need volunteers for middle school vendors at the play, the students need one hour of volunteering to qualify for their scholarships; will send QR code to our PTA to boost to help get kids sign up

• Shared Decision Making was site base team; last year decided to create Student Greeters; this year we have peer leaders that walk around helping the littles and greeting with high fives

- Creation Stations and Motivational Stickers:
  - Student Beautification project: working on sprucing up the bathrooms by putting up motivational quotes on the wall; especially students that need to recenter themselves and use the bathroom as a place to take a break
    - There are 400+ students so working on making sure all students are enjoying their recess time; not all kids want to play games; creating an alternative with a station that they can sign up to attend a creation station; piloting with the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students. Will be in the library space that was used for the Book Fair; craft stations, Legos; reading, starting in Mid-November and an adult will be present; 12-15 students ; sign up by signing up on

a clipboard in the classroom on a weekly biases; up to the teacher; starting it that everyone gets a turn if wanted and if a pattern is noticed the school will work on helping the kids be there with the children they want to be with organically

- Math hallway: reenforce math skills; skip counting and patterns to help with students interact
